THE SUIT

"The longer line of this blazer and the cropped kick-flare trousers are both really flattering. It's a bold look, but when it comes to tailoring, it's about taking what you want from it. I've teamed it with white heels – the statement shoe right now that I'm obsessed with (even though I spend my life cleaning them). You could dress this look down with a pool slide, though. A plain white tee underneath and no jewellery or accessories keeps it simple; the gold buttons on the blazer are enough detail."

THE HERITAGE-CHECK BLAZER

"These are everywhere at the moment – I'm collecting them! This one is oversized and made of linen – great for summer. It also has a tiny bit of pink in it, updating the traditional colour palette. You need solid colours underneath. I've tried a print clash, but it rarely works. This Finery dress is perfect and would look as good with boots in winter as it does with a loafer in spring."
